Include a copy of your high school transcripts.

**ESSAY**

- A. Type (font size 12, double spaced) or write legibly an essay regarding your educational and career goals. Include reasons for your choice of school, area of major, and a statement of how any scholarship funds received would be used in reaching your stated goals.
- B. Clearly state your personal financial responsibility and your family's ability to assist financially in your education. 500 words maximum. Be concise and thorough. List any other financial aid you are receiving.

**RESUME**

Including all extracurricular and co-curricular activities for the past 4 years, broken down by year. Include employment, community service, sports, awards, and leadership positions. Include the number of hours/days served for volunteer work and or employment.
