The Sutter Yuba Community Foundation invites applicants to apply for a scholarship to attend an accredited college or university. This is a one-time, up to \$5,000 award to be granted to a graduating high school senior. This scholarship is to be awarded from an endowment grant established by Frank M. Booth, Inc. for the dependents of current or retired Frank M. Booth employees.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the scholarship, student applicants must

- 1) Be a dependent of a current or retired Frank M. Booth, Inc. employee
- 2) Be a graduating high school senior
- 3) Maintain a 2.5 GPA overall, and
- 4) Show proof of acceptance into a 2 or 4 year college or university.

(1) ONE LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

Please submit one letter of recommendation, giving information about your character, ability to achieve the educational goal, ambition, and financial needs. Letters from the principal, vice-principal, attendance supervisor, counselor or teacher are preferred. Letters need to be signed and dated.

(2) TRANSCRIPT

Include a copy of your high school transcripts.

(3) ESSAY

Type (font size 12, double spaced) or write legibly an essay regarding your educational and career goals. Include reasons for your choice of school, area of major and a statement of how any scholarship funds received would be used in reaching your stated goals. 500 words maximum. Be concise and thorough. List any other financial aid you are receiving.

(4) PROOF OF ACCEPTANCE

From a 2 or 4 year college or university.

(5) A RESUME

Include all extracurricular and co-curricular activities for the past 4 years, broken down by year. Include employment, community service, sports, awards, and leadership positions. Include the number of hours/days served for volunteer work and or employment.

(6) A COPY OF THIS COMPLETED APPLICATION

Academic Performance	10 points
Recommendations	5 points
Activities and Community Service	25 points
Resume	15 points
Responsibilities and Financial Need	20 points
Essay	20 points
Total Maximum	100 points
